GENERAL INFORMATION

LATIN AMERICAN SOCIETY:

At the Annual General Meeting of the Society to take place on Wednesday the 8th May at 7.30 p.m., officers of the Society will be elected for 1968-69. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY:

Dr. Michael Lane, Department of Sociology, is trying to set up a panel of people who would be prepared to work for a minimum of 20 hours a week interviewing children and their parents and would like to know whether any wives or friends of members of staff would be interested in doing this type of work.
