C.B.W. Teach-In

MOTIONS PASSED

"We deplore the use of chemical warfare agents by the riot police against Paris students and pledge our whole-hearted support in their struggle".

Proposer Lee Calcraft. Carried unanimously.

"Stimulated by their discussion of C.B.W. the participants of this teach-in are extremely concerned at the lack of ethical discussion within this University. We therefore urge the Vice-Chancellor and Senate and the Boards of the Schools and the Staff/Student Liaison Committees to examine the dangerous trend towards specialisation in this University and to immediately take steps to provide a broad education including discussion of such ethical matters for all students of this University".

Proposer Gordon Cook. Carried unanimously.

"This teach-in on chemical and biological warfare strongly recommends that Senate explores the possibility of encouraging within this University the problems of war and peace".

Proposer Roy Cox. Carried unanimously.

"This teach-in strongly recommends the declassification of all work done at Porton Down and the removal of all Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Technology grants to British Universities".

Proposer Stephen Rose. Carried unanimously.
