ARRANGEMENT OF THE CHEMICAL SOCIETY LECTURE


"The Chemical and Biological properties of Toxic Chemicals"

by Dr. T. D. Inch - May 7th 1968

This academic year it was the intention of the Chemical Society to arrange a small number of lectures to be given by chemists working in research establishments other than Universities. The Society, therefore, invited speakers from such establishments as R.A.E. Farnborough, Metropolitan Police Forensic Science Laboratories and C.D.E.E. Porton Down. Invitations to give lectures were extended in August - September 1967.

The first letter sent to Porton Down was of a general nature enquiring about the possibility of a lecture on chemical defence mechanisms. It was suggested by Porton Down that a lecture might be given on some aspect of their chemical research. They asked for more specific guidance on the lecture topic and the Society replied giving the title quoted above. They accepted this title and suggested Dr. Inch as the lecturer.
